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## Mountain Bike Tire Guide

Mountain bike tire sizes typically look like this: 26×2.10 or 29×2.25 where the first number before the 'x' is the wheel diameter in inches. Most mountain bikes have 26-inch wheels; 29ers have 29-inch wheels. If you see a tire that's labeled in centimeters (700×23 for example) it's probably for road bikes.

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you'll run a lower tire pressure on a plus bike due to the rim width and sheer volume of the tire. A good guideline is start for the front tire is 16 PSI if you're a bit bigger. If you're 140 lbs or less, try 12-14 PSI.
